3. Definition

The at-risk-of-poverty rate shows the handful of people in low-income conditions who are below 60% of the median income 1 .

4. Calculation formula

$$= \left(\frac{Population_{60}}{Total\ population}\right) * 100$$

Where:

 $Population_{60}$ corresponds to the sum of people whose income is less than 60% of the national average.

5. Reading

Direct reading in percentage.

This percentage is an indirect measure of the poverty of a municipality since it is considered that people living below 60% of the average income of a municipality are in this situation. A higher percentage indicates more people at risk of poverty than the total population.


