The at-risk-of-poverty rate shows the handful of people in low-income conditions who are below $60 \%$ of the median income ${ }^{1}$.

$$

Where:
Population $_{60}$ corresponds to the sum of people whose income is less than $60 \%$ of the national average.

## 5. Reading

Direct reading in percentage.
This percentage is an indirect measure of the poverty of a municipality since it is considered that people living below $60 \%$ of the average income of a municipality are in this situation. A higher percentage indicates more people at risk of poverty than the total population.
