3. Definition

The extrem poverty risk rate shows the percentage of people on an income deemed below 40% of the average income¹.

4. Calculation formula

$$= \left(\frac{Población_{40}}{Población total}\right) * 100$$

Donde:

• *Población*₄₀ corresponds to the sum of people whose income is less than 40% of the national media.

5. Reading

Direct reading in percent.

This percentage is an indirect measure of poverty in a municipality as people living below 40% of the average income are considered to be in this situation. The higher this percentage, the more people at risk of poverty in this area compared to the total population.
